THE END OF THE LINE

Death. Most people ignore it. "I'll always have tomorrow", they think. Until they don't.

Death can come suddenly, or it can linger. Regardless, the result is always the same: an empty space at the table, a silent house, a void in your heart for those who are left behind.

Seems our congregation at Elmwood West Methodist Church has become reacquainted with death recently. Faces who used to be seen commonly in the pews of our church are now missing.

Death brings grief. The pain of the loss. The "what if" questions in your mind. The regret that you won't share one more day, one more hug, one more smile with the one you miss so desperately.

Jesus walked this path too. Four full days after his friend Lazarus dies, Jesus finally arrives at Bethany. He finds the sisters of Lazarus consumed with grief.

Martha lashes out at Jesus. She knows Jesus is Lord, so she approaches Him with her blame. "If you had been here, my brother would not have died".

It is a statement rooted a question:

Lord, why didn't you use your power to heal him?

Lord, you know I love you. Why are you putting me through such grief and pain?

Lord, how could you let this happen to a good man like him?

Jesus answers the unspoken question in John 11:25-26:

I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die.

Therein lies the hope that Christians have as believers. We can take comfort knowing that Jesus died but was resurrected from the dead and is seated eternally with God the Father. And if we believe in Him, we will do the same.

Lazarus' other sister, Mary, reacts differently. She is consumed with grief.

When Jesus saw her weeping, he was deeply moved in the spirit and troubled. "Where have you laid him?", he asked. "Come and see, Lord", they replied. Jesus wept.

Don't miss the shortest scripture in the Bible: "Jesus wept". Jesus was moved in the spirit by the pain of loss that Mary and the others were experiencing. He was stirred to the point where He wept with them.

Brothers and Sisters, this scripture provides two key concepts to comfort us when we experience the death of a loved one. First, if the loved one believed in Jesus, they live with him in eternity. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies.

Second, Jesus walks with us through our grief. He has experienced the pain of losing a loved one to death. He is "moved in the spirit" by your loss as well. You are not alone in your grief.

And friends, that is good news worth sharing!


