

The Discipline of Prayer from Faith Foundation by David Pratt

The short description in Genesis 5:24 summarized the life of Enoch, who "walked with God." He knew and followed God so thoroughly that people recognized the fruit of his faithfulness. His godly reputation was spoken of through generations. It's the kind of reputation every believer should want to cultivate.



Enjoying God and exalting him with our words and actions does not come naturally. We must be intentional in staying connected to him. David Platt shared a way we can remain close to God through prayer.

In Matthew 6:5–13, Jesus taught his disciples how to pray. Praying is a humble endeavor between us and God, who already knows what we need. Yet he desires that we talk with him anyway.

Prayer is less about getting something from God and more about knowing him more deeply. As we spend time with him regularly, whether alone for a period of time or on the go throughout each day, we develop a deeper connection with him.

In the acrostic David suggested, he began with P for Praise, echoing the first line of the Lord's Prayer in Matthew 6:9. Remembering what God has done in the world and for us should motivate us to praise him.

R stands for Repent. After praising God, we confess our sins and repent of them, coming clean before God. Our humility shows that we understand our rightful standing in his presence. And we can trust him when we repent because he has shown us his great love.

Now it's time to Ask (A). Tell God what's on your mind. Make requests for yourself, friends, family, world events, work, etc.—whatever is on your heart. He's ready to hear us. Looking to him for help is right and good. Think through the requests you typically bring to God.

Finally, to finish, PRAY we should Yield (Y) to the Lord's leading and will. We entrust ourselves to him and how he sees fit to answer our prayers and direct our lives.

Look forward to another successful year.


Homeschool is Back

New from the Methodist Food Pantry

In the month of July we were able to serve 659 families which represented a total of 1568 individuals.

At the end of June The Emergency Food Assistance Program released their new income eligibility guidelines. The amount is base off 185 percent of poverty level. The amount rose slightly over last years amount. A family of one can make up to \$2332 per month and qualify for our assistance. Family of two \$3152. Family of three \$3981. Family of four \$4810. Family of five \$5640. The amount increases about \$830 for each additional family member after this .

This is being put out so our donors and supporters can pass this information on to any family they know.


